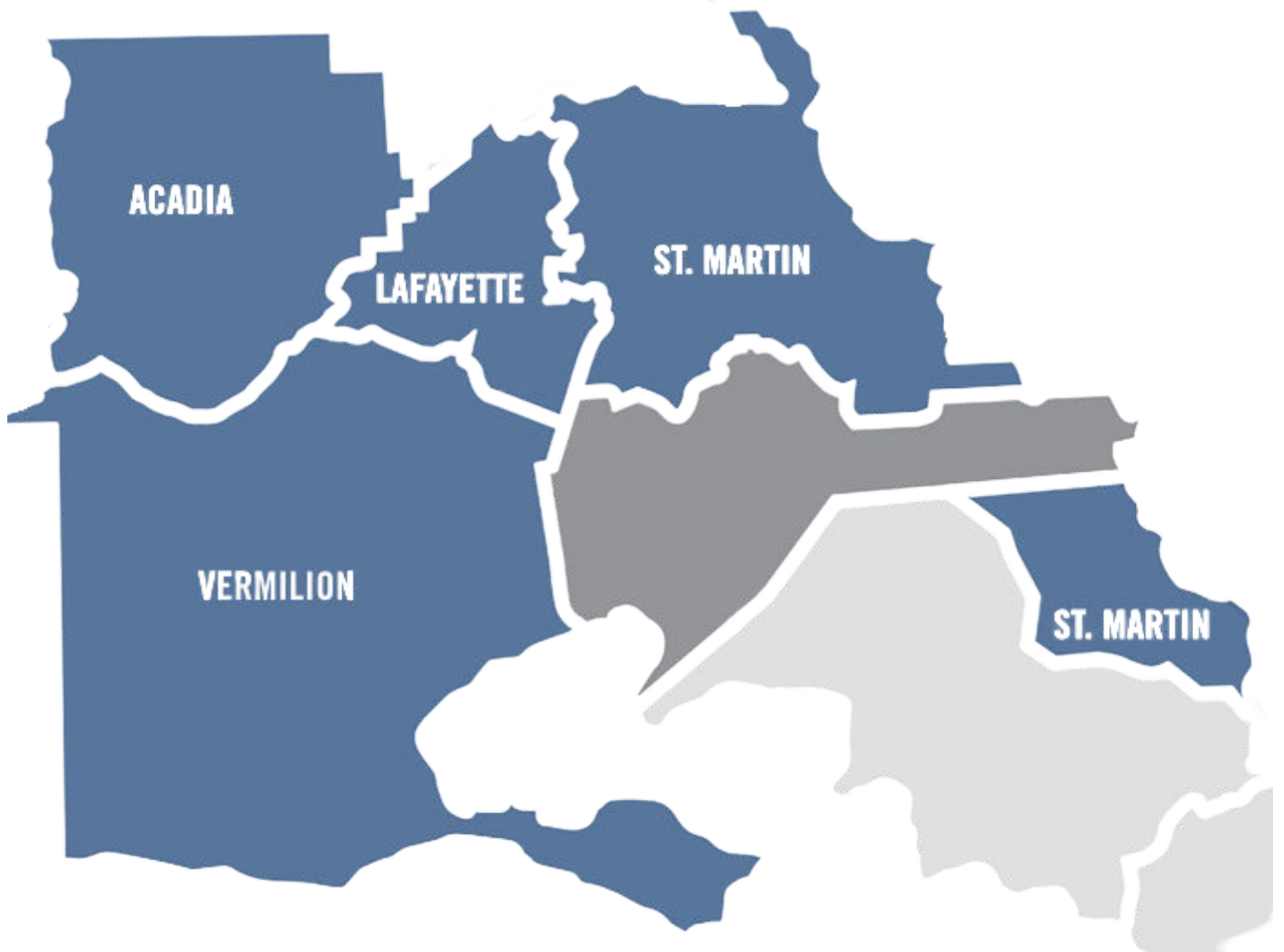

VOLUNTEER CENTER

In partnership with



In 2020, in a partnership with Parish Proud, United Way of Acadiana launched the virtual Volunteer Center, which aims to revolutionize how nonprofit organizations in Acadiana recruit by matching volunteer passions and skills with agencies' needs in the community. United Way of Acadiana has housed the Volunteer Center for several decades. The opportunity to provide a virtual platform for the work has generated renewed commitment and enthusiasm from hundreds of community members!

The Volunteer Center platform also aims to ease the volunteer experience as volunteers can create a profile with their interests and availabilities. Today, the platform has 55 active agencies and more than 1,927 volunteers registered. Experience the Volunteer Center at UnitedWayofAcadiana.org/Volunteer.

DAY OF ACTION

On June 26, 2021, we held our Annual Day of Action! Teams and individuals signed up through the Volunteer Center. Our volunteers were able to pick up more than 1 ton of trash, and Junior League of Lafayette took first place with more than 750 pounds of trash! This event was made possible by the Stuller Family Foundation and the Volunteer Center, powered by Parish Proud.



CASA OF SOLA

United Way of Acadiana and CASA of SoLA have been in a partnership agreement since 2020 to more completely serve those in need in Acadiana. With a growing implementation of "wraparound" services, where youth and families receive a comprehensive support team, this partnership was a natural step forward for both organizations.

CASA of SoLA not only serves children in foster care but has been working to provide child abuse prevention services to families to reduce the number of children entering foster care. A grant from The Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana Foundation initially facilitated the partnership between CASA of SoLA and United Way of Acadiana. This funding was to help stand up the My Community Cares program - one of five pilot programs in the state to better serve families that CASA of SoLA was entrusted with incubating over the last year.

CASA OF SOLA IMPACT:



Since 2008, CASA of South Louisiana has helped make a difference in the lives of foster children in Acadia, Lafayette, and Vermilion Parishes.



In 2021, CASA of SoLA supported and actively assisted more than **60 children** around Acadiana through advocates in the foster care system.



Forty-seven active and dedicated CASA volunteers are advocating for children in court.

2021-2022 PACT PARTNERS

LAFAYETTE EDUCATION FOUNDATION MERGER

In November of 2021, United Way of Acadiana announced the finalization of the merger agreement with the Lafayette Education Foundation (LEF), which pioneered the Teacher Awards for more than 20 years.

As part of the agreement, United Way of Acadiana will assume the responsibilities of the LEF endowment, investing the earnings in educational programming for the benefit of Lafayette Parish students.

The spending of funds will be recommended by an advisory committee made up of five former LEF board members for at least five years.



"We are thrilled that now the team at United Way of Acadiana can do what they do best – which is invest in improving educational outcomes for children in our community," said Blaise Zuschlag, the president of LEF that helped to shepherd the merger process. The first grant from the merger will be announced in spring/summer 2022.

232-HELP

232-HELP/211 receives calls from those most in need: the abused spouse in need of shelter, the mother struggling to provide food for her three children, the elderly who can no longer afford dental care, the individuals and families living on the street searching for shelter, and those seeking financial management skills in order to build a better life for their family.

United Way of Acadiana partners with 232-HELP because it is not just a phone number: it is a portal, a gateway, a vital community resource, a helping hand, and a kind voice around Acadiana.



HOW 232-HELPS:

- Provides services to a 10 parish region and almost 800,000 people.
- Collaborates with over 1,800 programs, offering over 2,600 social services to Acadiana.
- Advocates for those who cannot advocate for themselves.
- Assists in providing prescription medications when no other resources are available.
- Receives calls during natural and manmade disasters as part of the statewide 211 system, providing vital non-emergency information before, during, and after the event.
- Acts as a link in the statewide 211 emergency response system during a disaster.
- They are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to help serve the people of Acadiana.

AMERICAN RED CROSS

For more than 100 years, the American Red Cross has worked around Louisiana. United Way of Acadiana and the American Red Cross work together to reach a joint goal: to provide relief in the face of emergencies by mobilizing the power of volunteers and the generosity of donors.

WHAT THEY DO

The Red Cross members offer aid and resources to others to prevent, prepare for and respond to emergencies through immediate assistance, education, outreach, and training.

Today, in addition to domestic disaster relief, the American Red Cross offers educational programs that promote health and safety, support and comfort for military members and their families, and provide international relief and development programs. The Louisiana Region of the Red Cross serves the 4.65 million residents in the 64-parish state while supporting others across the country and around the world. Volunteers share their expertise on disaster relief operations out of state, and donors provide relief where it's needed most.



PROGRAMS OVERVIEW: EDUCATION

United Way of Acadiana is committed to achieving educational excellence in the region.



EARLY HEAD START

United Way of Acadiana Early Head Start (EHS) program provides early childhood education and home-based child development services for qualifying families with young children 0-3 years of age and prenatal services for expecting women at no cost to participating families.

In 2021, EHS provided 103 children in Lafayette and Vermilion Parishes. Enrollment priorities included children with disabilities, children in foster care, and families experiencing homelessness. Of the 103 children served, 100% received free hearing and vision screening, physical exams, and dental screenings.

In 2022, teachers and parents worked side-by-side to allow in-person learning. The EHS team is eager to utilize volunteers in our centers again soon. We are currently working to increase awareness of this vital work and its impact on our many donors and volunteers.

SIX DEVELOPMENTAL AREAS:

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL Children develop confidence, identity, and healthy relationships with adults and other children.

PHYSICAL Children demonstrate gross motor skills, fine motor skills, and safe and healthy habits.

LANGUAGE Children use expressive and receptive language, develop communication skills and distinguish sounds.

COGNITIVE Children become problem-solvers and show the ability to connect past, present, and future experiences.

LITERACY Children express an interest in books, identify letters, and notice rhyme, alliteration, and smaller units of sound.

MATHEMATICS Children develop and use mathematical skills and concepts.

LEADER IN ME

United Way of Acadiana is delighted to continue supporting *Leader in Me* schools in the world's largest region of *Leader in Me* schools. *Leader in Me* is a school-wide process based on Stephen Covey's *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People*. In addition to transforming school culture, it equips students with the key skills that businesses and educators have identified as vital for success in the 21st Century. Many people equate leadership with a formal position of authority, but in *Leader in Me*, leadership is a choice. Anyone can be a leader by intentionally leading one's own life according to the principles of the 7 Habits and that those habits are foundational to working well with others.

When implemented with fidelity, *Leader in Me* creates an environment where everyone in the school – from students to teachers to administrators – is encouraged to set and achieve meaningful goals through data tracking and accountability. Goals align at all levels, from the school to the student level, which results in students leading their own data chats and parent-teacher conferences.

In 2021, we welcomed 12 new schools to the *Leader in Me* family, and Eaton Park Elementary in Vermilion Parish has achieved the Lighthouse milestone this year. Despite a challenging 2021-22, schools find that *Leader in Me*'s focus on social-emotional learning inspires celebration and connection.

LEADER IN ME BY THE NUMBERS:



Sixty-four schools in the UWA region have implemented *Leaders in Me*, impacting 2,269 teachers and staff and 29,373 students!



Eight schools have achieved “Lighthouse Status,” a designation that belongs to only 12% of schools globally that have implemented the process with fidelity and obtained outstanding results.

PROGRAMS OVERVIEW: EARNINGS

United Way of Acadiana recognizes that financial stability is crucial to family success.



VITA: FREE TAX PREPARATION

United Way of Acadiana's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program provides individuals and families with free, reliable assistance with filing federal tax returns. Sponsored by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and Capital One Bank, the program offers support to families at or below the 250% Federal Poverty Guidelines.

United Way of Acadiana operates the VITA program throughout the Acadiana eight parish region. In 2021, with the challenges brought on by COVID-19, we saw a slight decrease in refund dollars due to fewer refunds prepared. Our goal in 2022 is to provide even more ALICE families with the opportunity to keep more of what they earned.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

Homebound Meal Delivery

Second Harvest Food Bank (alongside Volunteers of America and 232-HELP) and United Way of Acadiana created the Homebound Meal Delivery service in 2020 and have helped more than 6,000 people since then. This service strives to assist homebound families due to a lack of transportation or illness in the wake of COVID-19.

In 2021, we continued to repackage frozen meals from Second Harvest and deliver them weekly to those in need. As of December 1, 2021, UWA has served 60,188 meals to homebound clients across the Acadiana region.

Mass Distributions

United Way of Acadiana partnered with Second Harvest Food Bank and the University of Louisiana at Lafayette in two mass distributions in 2021, which provided food and supplies to thousands in our region.

March 2021 – 67,432 pounds of food

December 2021 – 27,719 pounds of food



COVID-19 RESPONSE

Defeating COVID-19: Answering the Community's Questions About Vaccines

On August 5, 2021, United Way of Acadiana, Woman's Foundation, the University of Louisiana at Lafayette Nursing Professional Development program, and Southwest Louisiana AHEC held an interactive webinar with local health professionals about the importance of getting vaccinated against COVID-19.

United Way of Acadiana is committed to ensuring the health and safety of everyone in our community, and this webinar allowed community members a safe place to get their questions answered.

Before the webinar, we collected questions from the community about their concerns or curiosity surrounding the COVID-19 vaccine and organized them for our health professionals to answer. More than 450 people joined the webinar for an insightful and engaging conversation. Afterward, we created an online resource center for our health professionals to answer any additional questions and include the link to the webinar recording.



HURRICANE IDA

United Way of Acadiana has a long history in the community providing disaster response and relief efforts. When Hurricane Ida hit the area in late 2021, the United Way of Acadiana team responded quickly and worked collaboratively to address needs in the community. Through a collaboration with Second Harvest Food Bank and Catholic Charities, United Way of Acadiana collected and distributed 66,248 pounds of food and supplies to families in need. United Way of Acadiana also works to streamline communications during disasters with other organizations through Acadiana Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (AVOAD).

United Way of Acadiana also plays an active role in long-term recovery, holding a seat at the table to help facilitate recovery discussions. Many in our community are still working to rebuild their lives for years to come.



COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT (CHNA)

Working with local organizations to address health needs

Ochsner Lafayette General, Our Lady of Lourdes, and the United Way of Acadiana worked together to create a joint Community Health Needs Assessment for the community. This joint effort represents the nine institutions represented by Ochsner and Lourdes systems as well as the input and efforts of the United Way of Acadiana.

Following months of interviews, focus groups, data compilation, the team recognizes the following community health priorities as part of this assessment process:

- Access to primary care
- Cancer
- Diabetes
- Health disparities
- Health education/literacy
- Heart disease and stroke
- Mental/behavioral health
- Maternal and child health
- Rural health
- Weight status and nutrition (obesity)



Thank you to our stakeholders who participated in the Joint Community Health Assessment survey, focus groups, and those who helped distribute the survey! UWA will utilize this information in the management of the Healthy Acadiana Coalition.

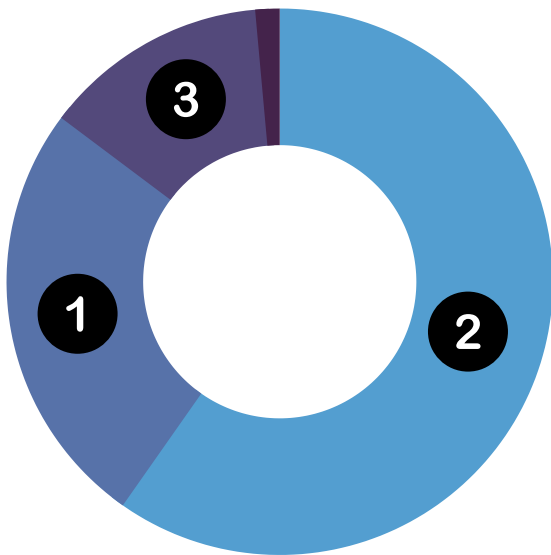

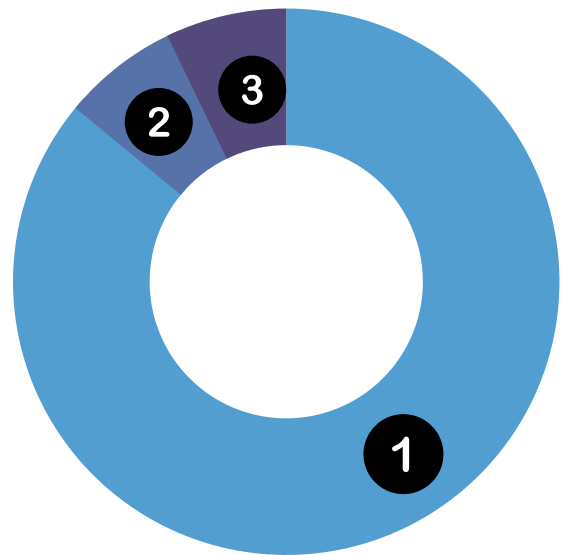
